

A list of definitions which should clarify some of the ideas of the "Rap."

bougie radical: a neurotic, bougie lifestyle in which a person who has not broken free of bougie socialization pretends to disavow it.

bourgeois decadence: the degeneration of the mind and the body that occurs in a person who conforms to the bourgeoisie; homosexuality, lesbianism, phony heterosexuality, intellectual prostitution, physical decomposition, etc. are involved in this phenomenon.

bourgeoisification: the socializing process that starts in elementary school where the raw material, the child, is fed into an assembly line, and a good bougie is the product.

classism: the hostility expressed by the exploiting class against the exploited class.

consciousness: an integrated mind-body state in which a person feels-thinks his/her environment.

corporate hate-state: the economic and political power bloc in monopoly capitalism that thrives on and engenders violence between human beings.

cortical mind-fuck: the dominant mode of aggression and sexuality in a technoid civilization, in which the techno-penis snuffs out all physical aggression and permits only mental warfare and distorted sexuality.

creativity: an individual's unique expression of his/her real perceptions/cognitions.

cult: an S&M dynamic where the leader(s) control [S] the followers; political comedians, musicians, etc. can develop subtle cults.

culture-civilization: a creation of thousands of years of dammed-up sexuality and instinct in human society; it is the biggest cult of all.

dialectics: a theory of reality that consists of examining phenomena in the context of opposites; black-and-white analysis is discarded for the subtleties of the gray area between opposites.

DNA power: the sheer genetic attractiveness of an individual that gives a person an edge in sexual competition.

econo-politico-sexual analysis: a social analysis that synthesizes radical economics, politics, and radical psycho-sexual theory, e.g., techno-penis, bourgeois vagina.
